

This bread was so tasty, all I have to show you is an empty pan.

Quick Herb Bread

- 3 cups Whole Wheat Flour
- 1 tablespoon Brown Sugar
- 1 teaspoon Baking Soda
- 1/2 teaspoon Baking Powder
- 3/4 teaspoon Salt
- 1 teaspoon each dried Thyme, dried Basil, dried Oregano, and Garlic Granules
- 1 Egg
- 1 cup Buttermilk
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/3 cup Olive Oil

Combine dry ingredients and wet ingredients in two separate bowls. Make a well in the dry ingredients and pour in the wet. Mix just until moistened.

Transfer batter to a 9in x 5in greased loaf pan. Bake in a 350 degree oven for 40-50 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool for at least 10 minutes before de-panning. Slice and serve.

Note: This bread is even better the next day!
