

Homemade Veggie Pizza

Friday night has become pizza night at our house, but we threw away the take out menus and instead make it ourselves. The dough is so much more flavorful than what we used to get from delivery and I know that it is made from good, whole ingredients.

Pízza Dough

- 3-3 1/4 cups white whole wheat flour
- 2 1/4 teaspoon active dry yeast
- 1 1/4 teaspoon sea salt
- 1 cup warm water between 120 and 130 degrees
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1. Combine 1 1/4 cup flour, yeast and salt in a large mixing bowl. Add water and oil. Whisk to combine and then continue whisking for another 3-4 minutes (if you prefer you can use an electric mixer on low for 30 seconds to bring it together and then on high for 3 minutes.)
- 2. Stir in as much of the remaining flour as you can.
- 3. Turn the dough out onto a lightly floured surface and knead in the remaining flour to make a moderately stiff dough (about 6-8 minutes). Should pass the window pane test (stretch a small piece of dough until you can see through it and it should not break).
- 4. Divide dough in half, cover and let rest for 10 minutes before tossing, rolling, and stretching to fit the desired pan.
- 5. Top with pizza sauce, cheese and various veggies and/or meat.
