Serve with a simple diced salad of cucumbers, jicama, tomatoes and bell pepper tossed with chopped mint, lemon juice and a bit of red wine vinegar.

## Black Eyed Pea Cakes

1/3 cup sour cream

5-6 dashes chipotle Tabasco Sauce (you would use 1 teaspoon adobo if it is handy)

1 1/2 cup dried black eyed peas

1/4 cup dry breadcrumbs

1/4 cup minced onion

3 large garlic cloves, minced

3/4 teaspoon cumin

1 teaspoon smoked paprika

1 teaspoon granulated garlic

1/2 teaspoon sea salt

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

1 egg, lightly beaten

olive oil

1/4 cup shredded cheese

Cook beans in a large pot of boiling water for 45 minutes to 1 hour or until tender. Drain the beans and move to a clean bowl, mash with a fork and then stir in the bread crumbs and the rest of the ingredients through the egg. Mix thoroughly. Heat oil in your favorite skillet and form bean mixture into patties. Cook patties for about 2 minutes on each side or until golden brown and thoroughly heated. Top each cake with shredded cheese of your choice.
